**1. Campus Center Building-** Start at the Information Desk on the first floor of the Campus Center Building. Here you can point out the Big Rock Bistro, the PTC Bookstore, Academic Advising, and Student Activities.

As you walk towards the library you can talk about our events usually held in the center of campus, like Welcome Week activities and Fall Fest. Also, you can give the group an overview of PTC including: our enrollment of 9,000 students, our 90+ programs, our 7 beautiful locations, and our hundreds of staff and faculty members who are ready and excited to help students.

**2. Ottenheimer Library-** The library is “the heart of campus.” It has almost 20,000 square feet full of print, multimedia, and electronic resources. It contains 42 computer stations, as well as 19 laptops that can be checked out and used inside the Library. There are 6 individual study rooms and 2 group study rooms. Every year in September the library puts on a “banned books week.” This year’s theme is Graphic Novels that have been challenged through censorship.

**3. Science Building-** This building was built in 1996 and it houses our Department of Mathematics, Natural and Social Science office. Science classes like Biology, Human A&P will be in this building. It's not just restricted to Science classes, some History, World Civilization, and other Fine Arts classes are in here as well. While walking to the Science Building, you can talk about our University Transfer Programs, the Associates of Arts and Associates of Science. These programs transfer to any college in the state. These are also the programs that the majority of students are enrolled in at PTC.

**4. Construction-** You've just walked out the side entrance of the Science Building, and now is a great time to point out the Fine Arts Building. It will open in the Fall of 2015. Also, you can talk about other recently completed construction projects at PTC, like the Culinary Arts and Hospitality Management Institute at our Little Rock-South Campus.

**5. Allied Health Building-** It was built in 2002. It is 33,000 square feet. It contains hands-on programs like dental assisting, LPN, Respiratory Therapy and Early Childhood Education. On the first floor is the early childhood education office and on the second floor is the Allied Health Department. Feel free to take your tour up to the second floor and let them see in the Dental Assisting Lab (3 doors down on your left) or the LPN lab (3 doors down on your right).

**7. Administration Building-** This is one of our oldest buildings on campus. It was built in 1976. It houses the Fine Arts and Humanities Division, Career Pathways, Trio Scholars, Veterans Upward Bound, the Office of the President, Administration offices, and classrooms. Student Ambassadors, one of our largest student groups is advised in the building. Student Ambassadors is a prestigious Pulaski Technical College program and student ambassadors receive a full tuition scholarship.

**7 & 8. IT Building/Business Technology Center-** The Information Technology Center was completed in 1999 and contains 40,000 square feet of instructional space, computer labs, an open computer lab, and a multipurpose community room. It houses the Information Technology Division. It is connected to the Business Technology Center which houses our Business Programs. One of our Student Groups, Phi Beta Lambda, is really active in business related fields. They recently took a trip to Disney World for competition.

You can also talk about all the wonderful business and IT Programs, including: the New Digital Media Program, or the Associates of Science- Business. The Associates

**9. You're done!** Finish back on the 2nd floor of the Campus Center Building. At this point you can show them the admissions, financial aid, and the cashiers office. You can take the group inside the Admissions Office to meet one of the welcoming student services representatives. Tell them how to apply and about admissions and financial aid deadlines. If they're first time entering you can tell them about the Presidential/GED Scholarships and the deadlines for application (August 1).

Also, you can point out the Veterans Services, the Tutoring Labs, and the Computer Labs on the 3rd floor.
