

early college program

about the program

Pulaski Technical College's Early College Programs offers college-level educational opportunities to current high school students. Students can enroll in classes at PTC to get a head start on their college degree or technical certificate.

There are two ways you can earn college credit as a high school student: **concurrent enrollment** and **dual enrollment**.

Concurrent Enrollment

Concurrent enrollment means that you are taking a class that counts for both high school and college credit. These classes may be offered at your high school or at a PTC location. Tuition for concurrent courses is usually lower than PTC's regular tuition rate.

Dual Enrollment

Dual enrollment means that you are taking a class that counts only for college credit. Tuition for dual enrollment is the same as PTC's regular tuition rate unless you are taking the class at your high school.

Students who participate in Pulaski Technical College's Early College Programs can take courses that are part of the Arkansas Course Transfer System or that count toward career or technical degrees.

Some high schools have agreements that allow students to bring high school credit to college. More information is available at pulaskitech.edu/early_college.



eligibility

To enroll and receive credit in PTC's Early College Programs, you must meet all requirements and complete all applications and forms as described in this handbook.

To be eligible for Early College Programs, you must:

- Have completed the 8th grade.
- Be enrolled in an accredited public or private secondary school or home school.
- Have a minimum high school GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. (Your high school may require a higher GPA.)
- Have the following ACT or COMPASS test scores:

Course	ACT	COMPASS
ENGL 1311	English 19 & Reading 19	Writing 80 & Reading 83
MATH 1302	Math 21 & Reading 19	Math 50 & Reading 83
ACTS Courses	Reading 19	Reading 83

- Meet any other prerequisite requirements for courses you wish to take. Prerequisites for approved Early College courses are listed at pulaskitech.edu/early_college.

WHAT IS A PREREQUISITE?

A prerequisite is a requirement, usually a test score or lower level course, that you must meet before you can take a class.

enrollment


To enroll and receive credit in PTC's Early College Programs, you must meet all program requirements and complete all applications and forms as described in this handbook.

To enroll in Early College Programs, you must:

- Apply for admission to PTC online at pulaskitech.edu.
- Submit your ACT or COMPASS test scores **and** an official high school transcript or GPA verification from your high school on the PTC Early College Enrollment Form.
- Complete the PTC Early College Enrollment Form. This form must be signed by you and your parent or guardian. The Early College Enrollment Form must be completed each semester.
- Receive approval from your high school. If you are taking courses for high school credit, your high school counselor, principal, superintendent, or designee must approve the courses and number of hours you wish to take by signing your Early College Enrollment Form.

When registering for classes as part of Early College Programs, you **cannot**:

- Take developmental (remedial) courses.
- Be seeking a degree or certificate.
- Take more than seven credit hours (with some exceptions).



Payment

Students are responsible for tuition, fees, and textbooks. Some high schools may provide textbooks. See [pages 8-9](#) for more information about the cost of Early College classes.

Financial Aid

High school students who are enrolled in college as concurrent or dual enrollment students are **not** eligible for federal financial aid.

According to federal policy, students who are enrolled in elementary or secondary schools are not eligible for financial aid from Federal Student Aid programs, even if the student is simultaneously enrolled in an eligible postsecondary program. A student is considered to be enrolled in a secondary school if the student is pursuing a high school diploma (34 CFR 668.32 (b)).

Grades

You will receive college-level credit for all coursework completed as part of Early College Programs. All grades will be posted to your official Pulaski Technical College transcript. More information about your official PTC transcript is available on [page 17](#).

getting started

Apply for Admission

Before your first semester at PTC, you'll have to apply for admission to the college.

Visit pulaskitech.edu and click "Apply Now" to complete the online application.

You must have a Social Security number to apply for admission online. If you do not have a Social Security number, contact the PTC Director of Admissions at (501) 812-2232.

After you apply, you'll be assigned a 9-digit PTC student identification number. You will use this number on college forms and to access student services. Once you have enrolled in classes, you will receive a PTC student identification card.

Turn in ACT or COMPASS Scores

ACT or COMPASS test scores are required for admission to PTC and Early College Programs. You can bring your scores to our Main Campus, CCB 240 or the Student Services Office at our Little Rock-South or Little Rock-West locations.

If you haven't taken the ACT, you can take the COMPASS at PTC or at your high school (if available). Information about COMPASS testing at PTC is available at pulaskitech.edu/testing.

Submit the Early College Enrollment Form

The Early College Enrollment Form must be completed **each semester** that you wish to attend PTC as a high school student.

The form is available at your high school, any PTC location, or at pulaskitech.edu/early_college. It must be signed by you, your parent or guardian, and your high school counselor, principal, or designee.

Meet with an Academic Advisor

To register for classes, you must meet with a PTC academic advisor. Your advisor will help you plan your schedule and sign up for classes.

Usually you will meet with your PTC advisor on your high school campus, but in some cases, you may need to visit your advisor at a Pulaski Tech location.

Pay for Classes

You are responsible for paying tuition and fees and for purchasing your course textbook. Some high schools may provide textbooks.

pay for classes

Tuition and fees **must** be paid when you register for classes or by the deadline listed at pulaskitech.edu/early_college.

The cost of your classes depends on the number of classes you take, whether you attend class at your high school or at a PTC location, whether your class is taught by a high school or PTC instructor, and whether you are a concurrent or dual enrollment student.



Dual Enrollment

Offered at a Pulaski Tech location, taught by a Pulaski Tech instructor, and taken for college credit **only**.

How to Pay

Depending on the type of classes you are taking, you can pay online or in person at the Main Campus in North Little Rock. Online payment information and payment deadlines are available at pulaskitech.edu/early_college.

Academic Scholarship

If the cost of your classes differs from the regular PTC tuition rate, the difference is considered an academic scholarship. You will receive a federal tax form 1098T reflecting this scholarship for income tax purposes.

Financial Aid

High school students who are enrolled in college as concurrent or dual enrollment students are **not** eligible for federal financial aid.

According to federal policy, students who are enrolled in elementary or secondary schools are not eligible for financial aid from Federal Student Aid programs, even if the student is simultaneously enrolled in an eligible postsecondary program. A student is considered to be enrolled in a secondary school if the student is pursuing a high school diploma (34 CFR 668.32 (b)).

transfer of credits

Arkansas Course Transfer System (ACTS)


Pulaski Technical College is part of the Arkansas Course Transfer System (ACTS). Students are guaranteed the transfer of applicable credits and equitable treatment in the application of credits for admissions and degree requirements to other public colleges and universities in Arkansas.

This means core, general education courses that you take as part of Early College Programs can be transferred to another public college or university in the state. Your credits can be applied to your degree. Most institutions require a grade of C or above for transfer.

get advised

PTC's academic advisors can help you learn more about how the credits you earn as part of Early College Programs can be applied toward a degree or certificate at PTC or transferred to another school once you graduate high school. You can meet with a PTC advisor at any time during the semester. They're here to help you plan for your future. Learn more at pulaskitech.edu/advising.



official transcript

● **What is an official transcript?**

A transcript is a permanent record of a student's college grades. It serves as official proof of college-level coursework. When you take classes as part of PTC's Early College Programs, you receive college-level credit for the courses that you complete. The grades you make in your classes will be reflected on your official transcript.

● **Why would I need an official transcript?**

Schools use transcripts to evaluate how much college coursework a student has completed. If you plan to take college-level courses at any other institution of higher education, you'll be required to submit your official Pulaski Technical College transcript to that institution.

● **How do I get an official transcript?**

Transcript requests are handled by the Office of Admissions and Records. You can request an official transcript from PTC online, in person, by mail, or via fax. Information about how to request a transcript is available online at pulaskitech.edu/records.

standards & policies

As a student in PTC's Early College Programs, you are held to the same academic standards and conduct policies as all PTC students, including academic integrity, consequences of plagiarism, and academic dishonesty.

All academic policies and the PTC Code of Conduct are described in full in the Pulaski Technical College academic catalog, which is available in a searchable, online format at pulaskitech.edu/admission/web_catalog.


PTC disciplinary proceedings can be instituted against a student charged with conduct that potentially violates the Code of Conduct. Proceedings may be carried out before, at the same time, or following criminal or disciplinary proceedings that may be initiated by a high school. The decision to initiate disciplinary proceedings is determined by the PTC Dean of Students.

Satisfactory Academic Progress

You are expected to make satisfactory academic progress in all courses completed. To make satisfactory academic progress as a student in Early College Programs, you must successfully complete your courses and maintain a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.0.

Concurrent students who do not make satisfactory academic progress will not be eligible to continue taking concurrent courses. Dually enrolled students who do not make satisfactory academic progress will be subject to PTC's Academic Probation and Suspension policy as described in the PTC academic catalog.

Your course syllabus will contain specific information about the grading standards for your class.

Academic Due Process

PTC policy allows students to appeal a grade or other academic matters, such as assignments, attendance, and classroom policies. Appeals must be made by the student during the course or immediately following the conclusion of the course, before the beginning of the next semester or term. Administrative Drop for Nonattendance

Instructors have the authority to drop students who do not consistently attend class in person or participate in an online course. Your course syllabus will contain specific information about the attendance policy for your class. More information about the PTC administrative drop policies for both in-person and online courses is available in the academic catalog.

standards & policies

Dropping or Withdrawing From Classes

If you want to drop one class or withdraw from all of your classes, you must complete a drop or withdrawal form. Forms are available at all PTC locations, in your high school counselor's office, or at pulaskitech.edu/early_college. The form must be turned in to a Student Services office at any PTC location or to the Director of Early College Programs.

You must drop or withdraw by specific dates each semester. These dates are listed in the PTC academic calendar at pulaskitech.edu/academic_calendar and in your course syllabus.

Audit Status

Dually enrolled students (students taking courses for college credit only) can change their schedule from credit to audit status. Audit courses are charged the same tuition and fees, but no credit is awarded for the class. Students will receive an AU for the course on their official PTC transcript. Students can change from enrolled to audit through the last day to make a schedule change.

Evaluation of Instruction

You will be asked to evaluate your instructor and the instruction for each of your classes each semester. You will also be asked to complete surveys regarding your experience with Early College Programs. Your evaluation will remain anonymous and will be used to improve PTC instruction and services.

The Pulaski Technical College Academic Catalog is a comprehensive guide to PTC's programs, policies, and services. The policies listed in this handbook are available in full in the academic catalog. The catalog is available in a searchable online format at pulaskitech.edu/admission/web_catalog.



FERPA

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law designed to protect the privacy of educational records. Student educational records are considered confidential and may not be released to anyone other than the student without the student's written consent*.

In a situation where a student is enrolled in both a high school and a postsecondary institution, the two schools may exchange student information. If the student is under 18, the parents still retain the rights under FERPA at the high school and may inspect and review any records sent by the postsecondary institution to the high school. When a student turns 18 years old or enters a postsecondary institution at any age, the rights under FERPA transfer from the parents to the student.

When you and your parents sign the Early College Enrollment Form each semester, you give Pulaski Technical College the right to share information with your parents while you are still in high school.



*Some information, called "directory information," may be released without the student's written permission. Directory information includes student name, address, telephone, e-mail address, dates of attendance, degrees received, major field of study, full- or part-time status, and date of birth. Students can request that directory information be withheld as confidential by contacting the Registrar at PTC.

standards & policies

academic dishonesty


Pulaski Technical College has rules against and penalties for academic dishonesty. Forms of academic dishonesty include, but are not limited to:

Cheating

- a. Copying from another student's test paper.
- b. Using any unauthorized assistance in taking quizzes, tests or exams.
- c. Possession during a test of materials that are not authorized by the person giving the test, such as class notes or specifically designed "crib notes," or any other device or technology that would aid in cheating.
- d. Dependence upon the aid of sources beyond those authorized by the instructor in writing papers, preparing reports, solving problems or carrying out assignments.
- e. The acquisition, without permission, of tests or other academic material belonging to a member of the Pulaski Technical College faculty or staff.
- f. Aiding and abetting another person in committing any form of academic dishonesty.

Plagiarism

Offering the work of another person as one's own without proper acknowledgment is plagiarism. Any student who fails to give appropriate credit for ideas or material he or she takes from another, whether a fellow student or a resource writer, is guilty of plagiarism. This includes downloading or buying papers from the Internet and cutting and pasting from the Internet without proper acknowledgment.



Other Forms of Academic Dishonesty

- a. Making, possessing or using any falsified college documents or records; altering any college document or record, including identification cards.
- b. Knowingly providing false information to college officials, including disciplinary meeting bodies. Passing insufficient funds checks or fraudulent money orders in payment of any financial obligations to the college.
- c. Falsely claiming to represent the college or a registered student organization of the college.

Procedure for Discipline of Cheating and Plagiarism

The responsibility and authority of initiating discipline arising from violations of the rules against dishonesty during the process of the course are vested in the instructor of that course.

Penalty

If, in the judgment of the instructor, cheating or plagiarism has occurred, the penalty assessed could be a grade of "F" in the course. The instructor will notify the student of his or her decision concerning the student's grade. Students should understand that offenses of cheating may also subject the offenders to disciplinary action. The PTC Dean of Students shall determine if disciplinary action is warranted.

starting classes

what to do

Be prepared.

Your instructor expects you to have your textbooks and any other required course materials on the first day of class. You should also bring paper and a pen or pencil to take notes and a folder or binder to keep your classwork organized.

Students who aren't prepared on the first day of class often fall behind and have a hard time catching up. Preparing for the first day of class will set you up for a successful semester.


Know where and when your classes are.

Your schedule lists the classrooms and buildings where your classes are located. If you're new to PTC, explore campus and find your classrooms before the first day so you'll know where to go.

You should also know the times of each of your classes. Being on time to class is important for the first day and every day of the semester.

WHERE DO I GET MY BOOKS?

Bring a copy of your schedule to the Bookstore at Main Campus on the first floor of the CCB or the bookstore at the Little Rock-South location. Some high schools may provide textbooks for concurrent courses.



Attend class.

You're expected to be in class on the first day—and every day. Your instructor has the authority to drop any student who does not consistently attend class.

Sometimes things happen, and you may have to miss class during the semester. When you're absent, class will move forward. It is your responsibility to stay caught up with your class and assignments. Focus less on why you were absent and more on what you missed.

Read and understand the syllabus.

You'll receive a syllabus in each of your classes on the first day. Make sure you read and understand your course syllabus. If you have questions, ask your instructor.

Understanding your syllabus will ensure that you and your instructor are on the same page from the very first day.

Keep your syllabus handy throughout the semester so you can refer back to it as needed.

WHAT IS A SYLLABUS?

A syllabus is a document that explains your class. The syllabus gives an overview of what you'll do in the class and explains the learning outcomes for the course. It also includes attendance requirements, grading standards, assignments, drop dates, and contact information for your instructor.

starting classes

tips for success

Be involved in class.

Attending class is more than just being there. Your instructor expects you to be actively involved. During class, you should be focused only on what is happening in class. This will ensure you get the most out of your class time.

Being involved means:

- Focusing on your instructor's lecture
- Taking notes and following along in your textbook
- Participating in discussions and group work
- Completing in-class assignments and activities
- Asking questions


Complete your homework and study outside of class.

A lot of the work you'll do in college happens outside of the classroom. The general rule is that for every one hour you spend in class, you should spend two to three hours outside of class studying and completing homework or other assignments. Working outside of class will reinforce what you've learned in class and help you be prepared.

Ask for help.

If you need help, don't be afraid to ask your instructor. Chances are that if you have a question, your classmates are wondering about the same thing.

tips for online classes

- **Know your instructor's attendance policy.**
Attendance in an online class is more than just logging on. You may have to complete an assignment to be counted as present in class.
- **Familiarize yourself with your online course.**
You'll need to know where things like course materials, assignments, tests, and grades are located.
- **Follow all assignment deadlines and due dates.**
You'll have to set and stick to a schedule to complete your work.
- **Stay motivated and involved.**
You're responsible for completing your work on time and meeting your instructor's expectations.

Parking Sticker

If you're attending class at a PTC location, you need a parking sticker. Register your vehicle on the "Students" tab of the MyPTC portal. Then pick up your sticker at the Cashier's Office on the 2nd floor of the CCB at Main Campus.

how to continue at PTC

Apply

Apply for admission to PTC as a First-Time College Student. Go to pulaskitech.edu to apply online. Be sure to apply for the first semester after your high school graduation.

If you want to apply for financial aid, you'll be eligible as a First Time College Student. Visit pulaskitech.edu/financial_aid for more information.

Turn in Required Items

Transcripts. We'll need a high school transcript that is official, final and in a sealed envelope from your high school. If you took college classes at a school other than PTC, you'll need to submit official transcripts from each college or university you attended.

Test Scores. We can use the scores you submitted in your high school concurrent application if they are less than 5 years old. If they are more than 5 years old, you'll need to submit new ones.

Shot Records. First-Time College students must turn in proof of 2 MMR (measles, mumps, and rubella) immunizations. Students born outside the US may need to submit proof of tuberculosis screening.

Once all your documents have been processed, you can meet with an academic advisor to schedule your classes.
