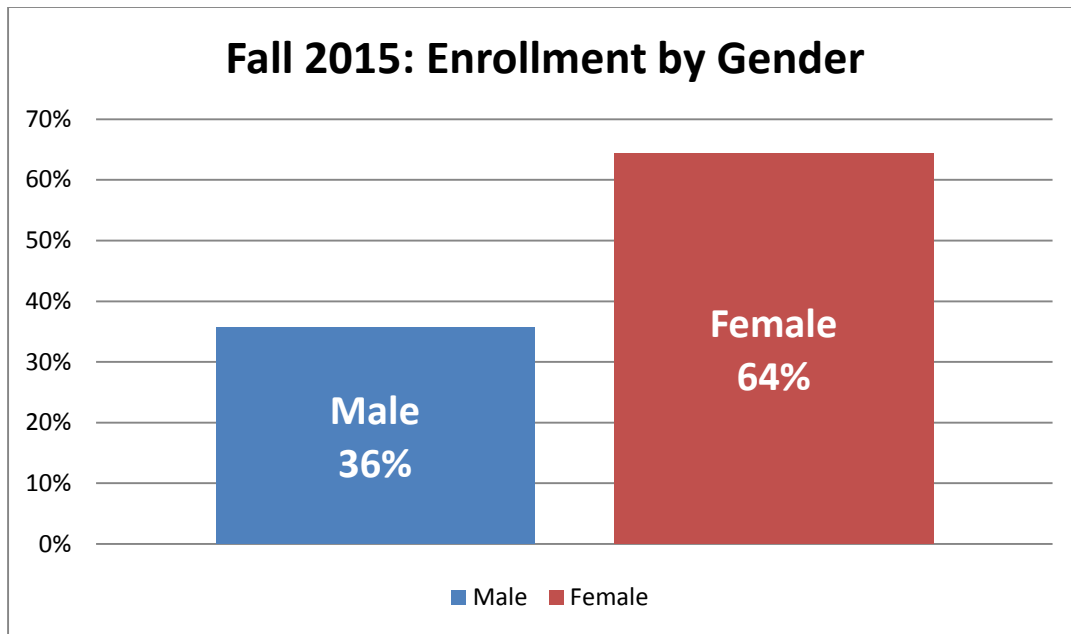

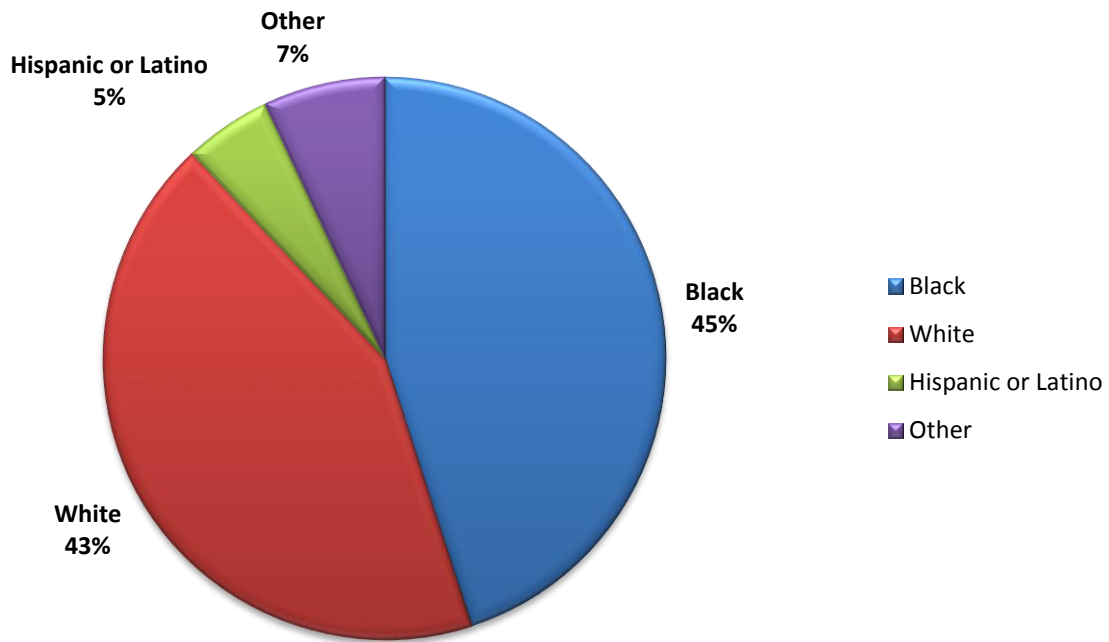
Females continue to enroll at a significantly higher rate than males.

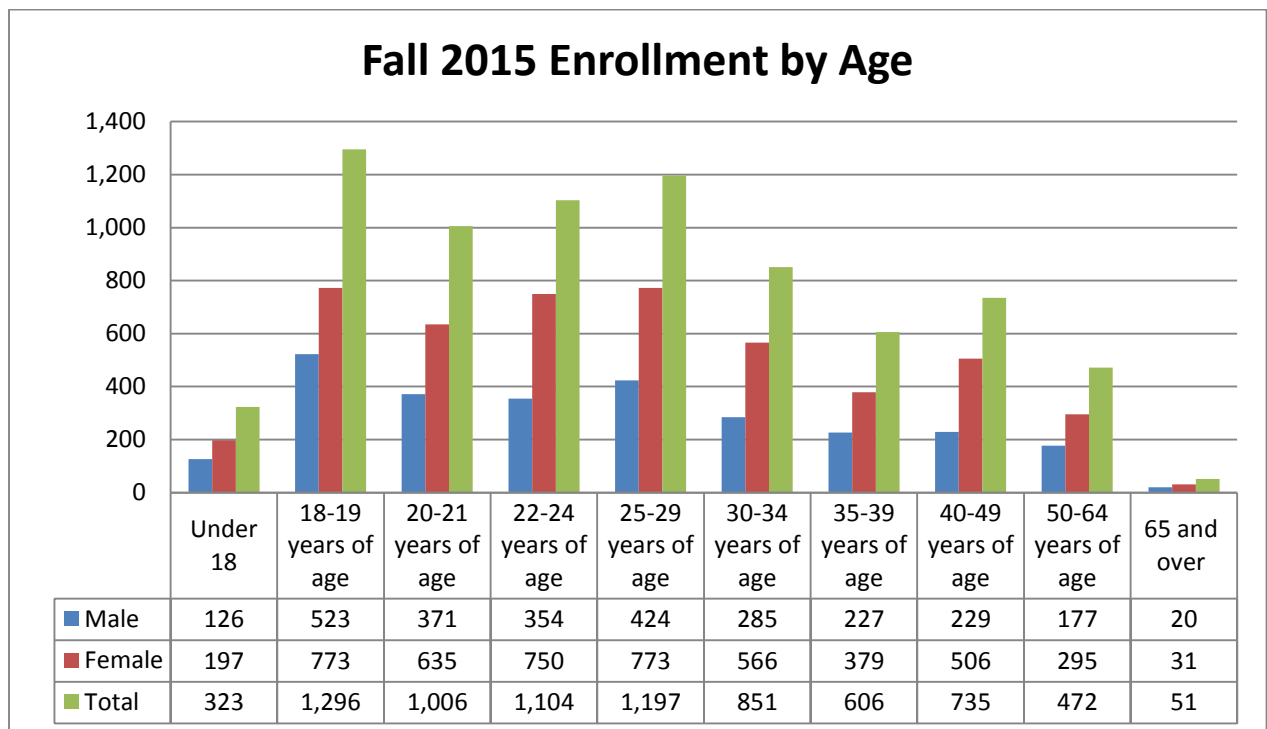

Fall 2015: Average Enrollment Age - 29



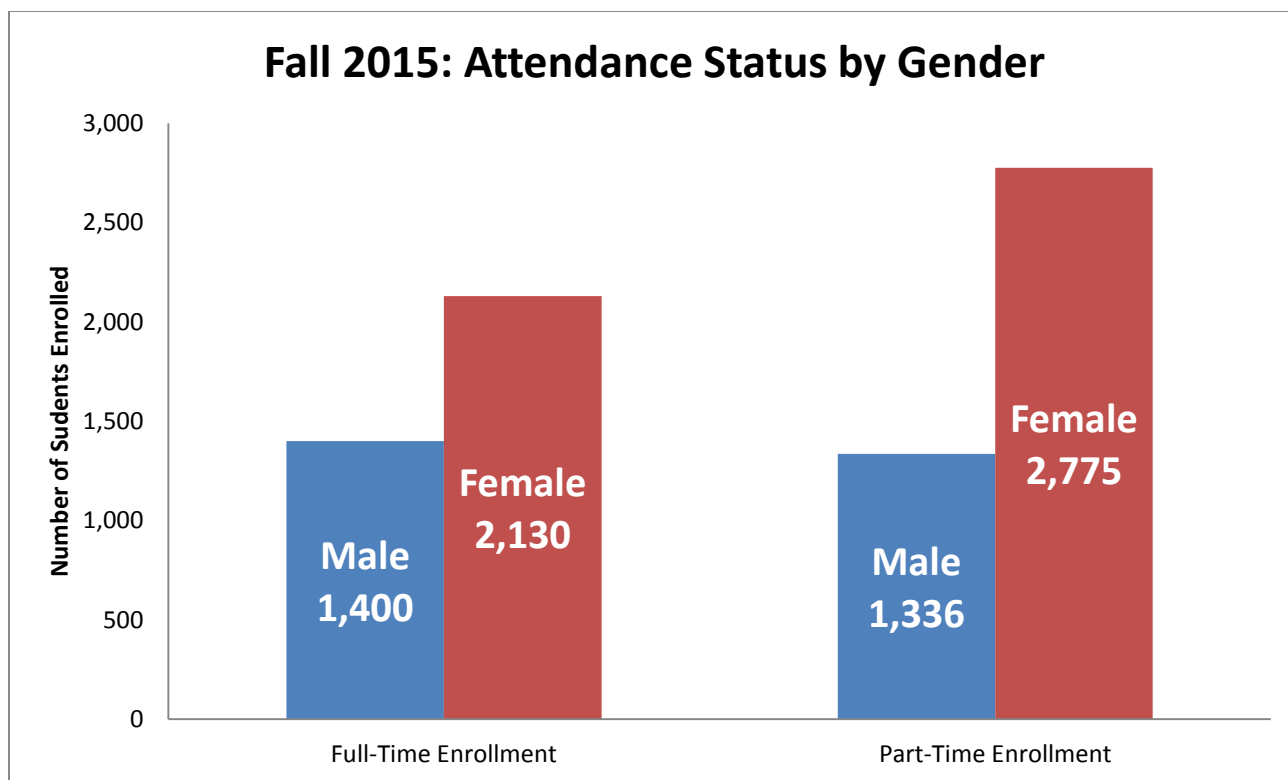

The enrollment of female students under 18 increased by 15% and overall enrollment increased in this age category by 6%. The most significant drop in enrollment occurred in males age 65 and over, which was also the case in Spring 2015.

Full-Time enrollment decreased by 1% while part-time increased by the same percentage. Part-time enrollment continues to be higher than full-time.

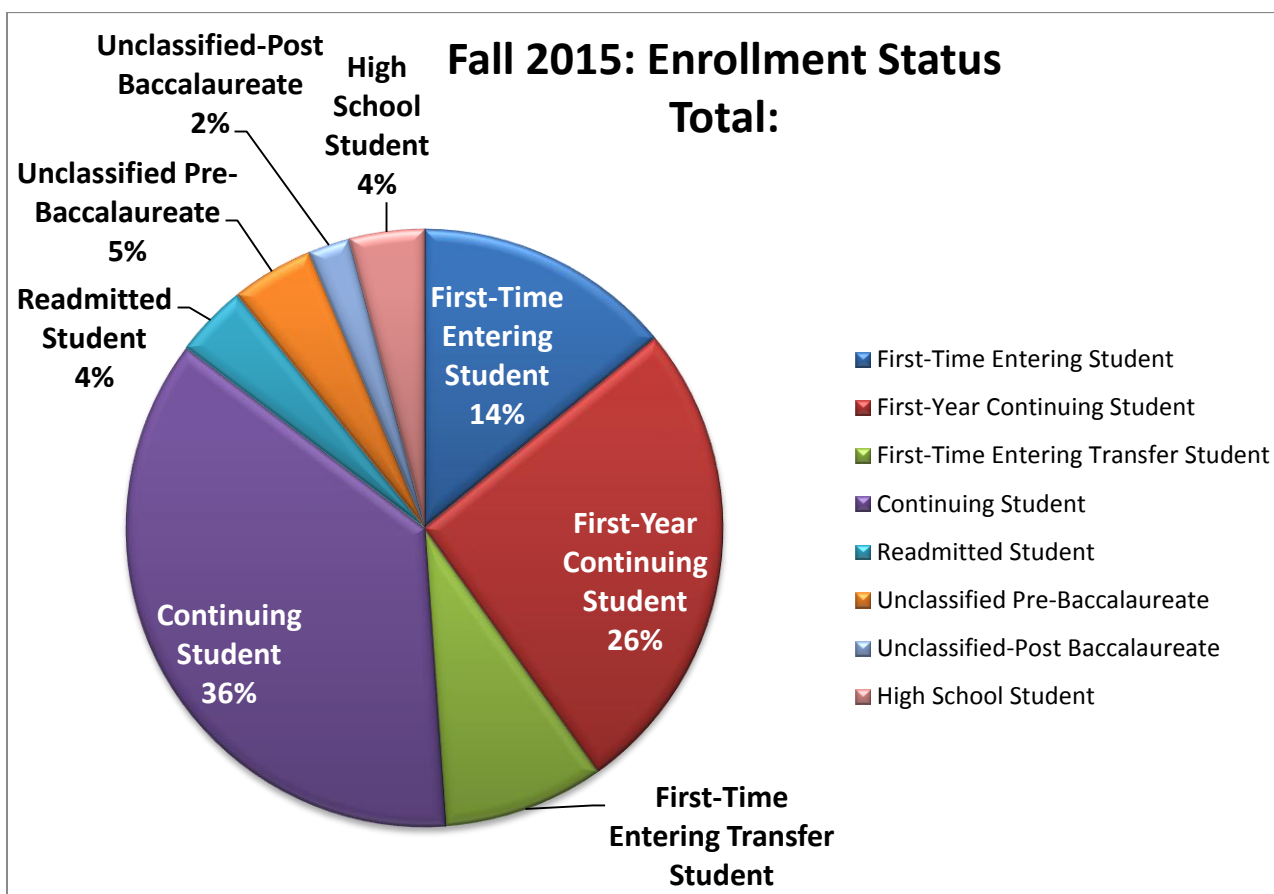


Females continue to enroll at a significantly higher rate than males in both the full-time and part-time attendance categories. The percentage of total male enrollment attending full-time is 49% while part-time attendance is slightly higher at 51%. Full-time enrollment of females is 43% while part-time enrollment is much higher at 57%.

The full-time enrollment category decreased by 19%, while part-time was slightly less with a decrease of 16%.

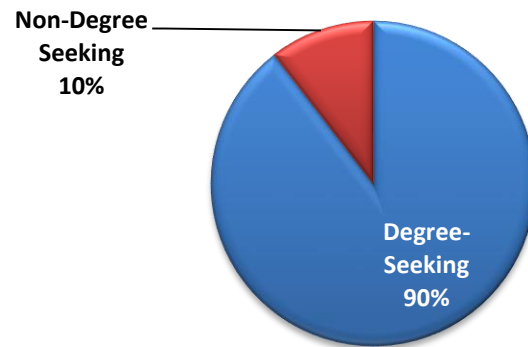

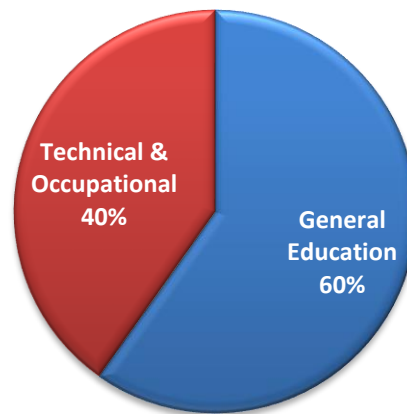

First-time entering student enrollment increased by 1%. First-year continuing students experienced the highest percentage decrease as a percentage of overall enrollment which is indicative of students not being retained. However, second year continuing students increased by 2%. The same percentage of decreases and increases were reflected in the Spring 2014 to Spring 2015 enrollment reports.

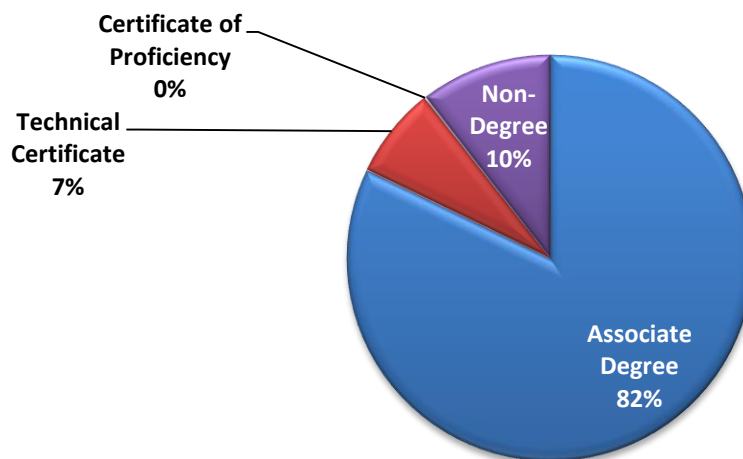
Fall 2015: Degree Intent



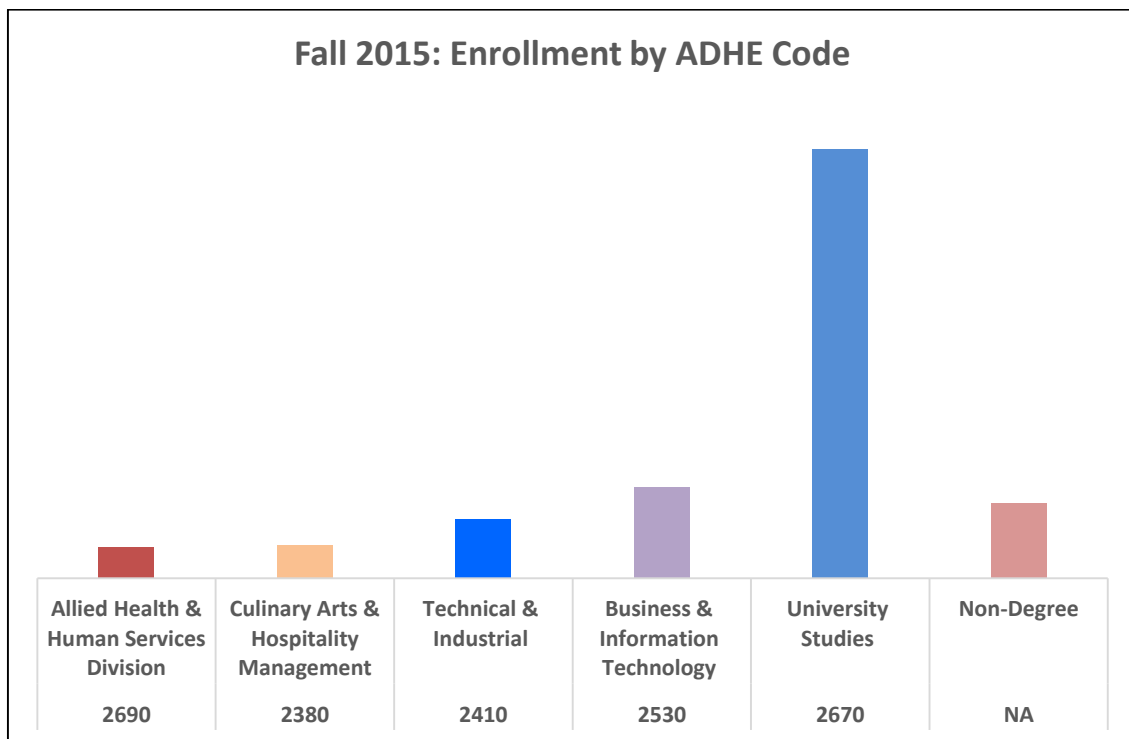
Fall 2015: Degree Type
